Thyranoixia (Door Blessing) Speech, October 5<sup>th</sup>, 2025 by Fr. Thomas Manuel

Your Eminence Metropolitan Apostolos of New Jersey, Reverend fathers, brothers and sisters in the Lord.

We all open and pass through doors constantly in our lives. We probably pass through them thousands upon thousands of times. Most of those times we pass through them, we do not think about the significance of what we are doing. For us, to open a door and to pass through it is uneventful, routine and mindless. We move from one room to the next, from inside to outside, without hesitation. It is rare that we think through the importance of the idea of opening a door.

# Message from Fr. Thomas continued...

But today is different. The passage through the doors that took place at the blessing this morning was not your normal passing through a door. It was significant and full of meaning. We did not simply pass through a door mindlessly, but we took our time to pray to the Lord our God that He bless the opening of our new church's doors. Why did we do this? To pass through a door is to end one thing, and to pass onto something new. It is the end of one phase, and the beginning of a new phase.

In our Orthodox Liturgical life, we see this most starkly at the great feast of Pascha, our Lord's Resurrection, where our Lord Jesus Christ passes from death to life. This is shown both at the Pascha vigil and in today's service through the dialogue that takes place between Metropolitan Apostolos outside the door in the place of Christ, and another person from within the building who answers his questions. The dialogue says,

Metropolitan-"Lift up the gates, O you rulers, and be lifted up, you everlasting doors, and the King of glory shall enter.

Response-Who is this King of glory?

Metropolitan -The Lord strong and mighty, the Lord powerful in battle."

(Psalm 24:7-9)

These verses come from Psalm 24: 7-9. They capture the cosmic drama of the King of Glory, that is Jesus Christ, breaking down the bars and gates of Hades, trampling down death by death, and restoring life to those in the tomb. In this great mystical passage, we see the end of the reign of sin and death in the world, and the coming of a new life in Christ. That is the passage, Passover or Pascha, that our whole faith is centered upon. So in fact, doors take a central role in the theology of our Orthodox faith.

So what is the passage for us then on this day? What is the meaning of this door blessing for us?

t is the beginning of a new and challenging phase in the life of our Holy Apostles community. It is I the movement from our temporary building that nurtured us while we were young, to our new and permanent home that will carry us on into adulthood and maturity. This new phase will have many blessings: we can expand the ministry and the outreach of our church and host more programming for the uplifting of our faithful. We can also grow in holiness and mutual love in our new and permanent home. It will also be challenging. With all growth comes growing pains. We will encounter struggles we have yet to face before as we grow into maturity in our church home. The Lord will present us with new doors, new passages, by which we must pass. As long as we as a community continue to seek the Lord and to place Him at the center of our communal life, we will be able to overcome all challenges that stand against us.

As the Lord Himself tells us,

"Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened." (Matthew 7:7-8)

The Lord will not ignore or forget about those who persist in seeking a deep and meaningful relationship with Him. We now are seeking the Lord, and knocking on His door, that we may have communion with our Lord.

May this day and the blessing of the new property be for us a day of joy and gladness. Thank you Your Eminence Metropolitan Apostolos for your unflagging support and love for our community. And thank you for coming and blessing our new church home. For helping pass from one phase of our spiritual life to the next. We who passed through the doors this morning, may we find the Lord our God waiting for us on the other side, so that we may grow is His glory.

### Men's Group: St. Andrew's Brotherhood


